

RRRC Range Regulations

Revised 7/7/2015

1. Each member shall be fully responsible for his/her actions, as well as the actions of invited family members and guests, (see "Ethical Conduct Requirements and Standards") including assurance that the posted firearm safety rules are carried out. **EACH MEMBER MUST WEAR THE THEIR MEMBERSHIP CARD WHILE ON CLUB PROPERTY!**
2. Firearm safety rules are posted on Ranges A, B, C, D, and Clays. It is the responsibility of every person on the range and on the firing line to ensure that all firearm safety rules are obeyed at all times.
 - a. On the Clays ranges, no shot larger than #7.5 shall be used, except for the patterning board, and no shells longer than 2.75 inches. No magnum loads or 3 inch shells may be used.
 - b. No shooting is allowed on Range "D" unless approved by and/or accompanied by the Training Director or the Chief Range Safety Officer.
3. Each firearm's action shall be open and the firearm unloaded, except when on a firing line. *There are two exceptions to this rule: Break-open type rifles and shotguns may have their actions closed while in the rack, but MUST be opened immediately upon removal from the rack. Handguns may have their actions closed while in the holster, but MUST be opened immediately upon removal from the holster.*
4. Prior to anyone proceeding down range, it shall be the **MEMBERS RESPONSIBILITY** to verify that all firearms on the firing line are unloaded with their actions open and placed on the bench or in a rack. **NO FIREARMS MAY BE HANDLED OR CLEANED WHILE ANOTHER PERSON IS DOWN RANGE! Cleaning and adjustments MAY be made on the tables behind the firing line benches PROVIDED THE GUN IS UNLOADED and pointed in a safe direction!**
- 4a. On Range C, the red warning lights must be ON prior to anyone proceeding down range.
5. Eye and ear protection **MUST** be worn at all times while on or near the firing line.
6. All shooting on Ranges A and C **MUST** be conducted perpendicular to the firing lines and berm. Board-approved exceptions can be granted to Match Directors and/or Range Officers for scheduled matches on these ranges. **Cross lane shooting is a safety violation and will result in permanent dismissal from Roanoke Rifle and Revolver Club.**
- 6a. The direction of fire on Range B **MUST** be between the Orange Safety Markers at ALL times. The only exception is Organized Matches under the direction of Board-approved Match Directors and/or Range Safety Officers.
7. No shooting on any RRRC range between 9pm and 7am (except for members hunting).
8. **No tracer, armor piercing or incendiary bullets, or explosive devices are allowed.**
9. **No glass targets are allowed on any range.**
10. No shooting of target frames, foundations or rocks. This is a safety violation and will result in permanent dismissal from Roanoke Rifle and Revolver Club.
11. No Class III firearms allowed on club property unless accompanied by written authority from the Board of Directors. Do not be alarmed to hear full-auto this is permitted with the above authorization. **Slide stocks are not allowed on Club Property.**
12. **ALL SHOOTING SHALL BE DELIBERATE AIMED FIRE at APPROPRIATE TARGETS ON RANGES ONLY, except for hunting. NO UNAIMED FIRE IS PERMITTED.** Slide Stocks modifications are not allowed on Club Property!
13. Members are required to clean up their firing-line stations and other areas that were utilized on the ranges. Used materials, including spent brass, casings, hulls, cases, cleaning patches, targets, backers, food, and other debris, for which they are responsible, are to be **PLACED IN THE DUMPSTER OR TAKEN HOME!**
14. The Board of Directors has the right to grant exceptions for matches and special events.
